

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting Adams County Services Building, Othello

June 14, 2000

The regular meeting of the Adams County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Bill Wills on Wednesday, January 14, 2000, at 9:00 a.m. in Othello. Commissioner Jeffrey W. Stevens was present. Commissioner W. L. Schlagel was absent.

The board went into executive session per published agenda with Kate Brueske from 9:00 a.m. until 9:10 a.m. under RCW 42.30.110(1)(g) for purposes of employee evaluation.

Kate Brueske requested approximately ten (10) minutes of executive session under RCW 42.30.110(1)(i) - potential litigation. Executive session was held from 9:11 a.m. until 9:17 a.m.

Commissioner Stevens moved, Wills seconded, to authorize the chairman to sign the Agreement between the Service Action Chemical Dependency Center, Kennewick, and Adams County for the center to provide detox services for Adams County. Motion carried.

Commissioner Stevens moved, Wills seconded, to authorize the chairman to sign the Agreement to provide Mental Health Services to the Washington State Migrant Council. Motion carried.

Commissioner Stevens moved, Wills seconded, to authorize the chairman to sign Amendment #1 to the RSN Contract to provide for mental health services to the dangerously ill offender effective July 1, 2000. Motion carried.

Community Counseling Services Director Brueske discussed office space needs within the County Services Building.

The board went into executive session per published agenda with Dee Caputo from 10:05 a.m. until 10:23 a.m. under RCW 42.30.110(1)(g) for purposes of employee evaluation.

Building and Planning Director Caputo discussed "zone" changes throughout the county and was requested by the board to begin a "work program" to facilitate development and adoption.

In other matters, a meeting is scheduled for July 20, 2000 to discuss "Moon Street" and work continues on the "Traffic Study".

Judge DuBois requested additional hours for employees within the office following cuts that occurred before adoption of the 2000 budget. Following discussion, the board by consensus agreed to increase by 2.5 hours per week the total hours for two of the employees who had previously been cut hours.

There being no further business to come before the board the meeting adjourned at 12:00 noon.
