

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting Adams County Services Building, Othello

October 11, 2000

The regular meeting of the Adams County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Bill Wills on Wednesday, October 11, 2000, at 9:00 a.m. in Othello. Commissioner Jeffrey W. Stevens was present. Commissioner Schlagel was absent.

Commissioner Stevens moved, Wills seconded, to approve D.A.R.E. Services Contract between Adams County Community Counseling and the Adams County Sheriff which provides a portion of the funding (\$4,007) for a Deputy to perform D.A.R.E. prevention activities. Motion carried.

Commissioner Stevens moved, Wills seconded, to approve Work Order Amendment #2 DASA Interagency Agreement. Motion carried. This continues the State Incentive Grant funding for the Boys and Girls Club in Othello. Adams County Community Counseling is the fiscal agent for the grant.

Commissioner Stevens moved, Wills seconded, to approve the DSHS Work Order between Adams County Community Counseling and the Juvenile Rehabilitation Administration which provides for the provision of mental health services to juvenile parolee's and their family. Motion carried. This contract provides approximately \$5,000 over a nine-month period of time.

Commissioner Stevens moved, Wills seconded, to approve the D.A.R.E. Services Contract between Adams County Community Counseling and the City of Othello Police Department which provides a portion of the funding (\$4,007) for a Deputy to perform D.A.R.E. prevention activities. Motion carried.

Building and Planning Director Caputo and Planner Anderson reported on the progress and current status of the county rezone/comprehensive plan update project. Status of the SEPA requirements, of the public participation activities, and of the development of a plan of action based on the input from the "workbooks" distributed to approximately 350 agencies/individuals were included in the discussion.

Caputo updated the board on the status of the development of a work program relating to the cell tower moratorium. It was reported that a number of new applications have been received all requesting "co-location" approval.

Portions of the proposed 2001 budget were reviewed and discussed. Caseload numbers will be requested from Superior Court, District Courts, Juvenile, and the Prosecuting Attorney to assist with Criminal Justice funding allocations in 2001 as well as with facility use planning in the future.

There being no further business to come before the board the meeting adjourned at 11:00 a.m.
