# **Integrated Health Care Services**

- Consolidated Contract CLH18235, Amendment No.1, between Washington State Department of Health and Adams County for an increase of \$5,500 for a total contract award of \$296,231 for the period 1/1/2018 through 12/31/2020; (adds statement of work for childhood lead poisoning prevention; amends statement of work for WIC); and,
- Washington State Association of Local Public Health Officials (WSALPHO) and Adams County for a continuation of administrative match services for the period January, 2017 through December, 2018.
